

## Geography Y6 transition task - Treasure island

For this task, you need to create two things: a treasure map and a story about your journey to find the treasure.

Your map must be half a page to a page and your story can be up to two pages long.

You can be as creative as you like and your map and story must include lots of geographical information. Include things you have studied at school as well as anything you have researched independently at home. See below for some hints and tips of what to include and an example of a map and the start of a story.


### Map hints and tips

- Include a clear start point.
- Draw a path through your map to follow.
- Include a clear red x to mark the treasure at the end of your path.
- Add features to your map e.g. a coniferous forest, a river meander, a volcano, a mountain peak, a church etc.
- Add a north arrow, a title and a distance scale to your map.
- Add numbers for each grid square.

### Story hints and tips

- Write 4 and 6 figure grid reference for features along your journey.
- Add a description of the location and climate of your treasure map e.g. Amazon Rainforest.
- Add descriptions of the features you pass along the path and explanations of how they were created e.g. cave, arch, stack and stump, a volcano, a tropical rainforest.
- Add a description of plants and animals you pass along the way and an explanation of how they have adapted to live there.
